Just recently hearing of the devastation in Haiti from the earthquake, jumped started my memory of the time I visited Haiti. I know your probably thinking - why in the word HAITI? Right, I am wondering, too, but way back in 1974 while working at China Town on Kellogg Ave. I was asked if I would like to take a trip. At the time Bob Bloomhuff (most of you remember him from the Legion) had help join and form a travel club called Travel Go GO. It was a much older plane, with 4 engines, as I remember this as I looked out the window watching them but not thinking about what or could happen. At the time I mentioned it to my mother and she immediately agreed to go with me if I decided. Now I am thinking maybe both of us were off our noodles a little. Maybe I thought it was some kind of paradise.

We left on Thursday and were back on Sunday, not thinking about what I was going to do. I knew I had taken some pictures and found them in an album just in case does not believe me, they are available to see. The hotel that is mentioned, The Montana, was demolished from the earthquake and probably was the same one that we stayed in but a different name, quite nice and modern and sat on a hill. After arriving there I thought what in the world am I doing here.

Not ever being out of the states before and away from home, we witnessed the most poverty that anyone could imagine. The first day there I stood on the balcony to admire the scenery but all I saw was people motioning to their mouths and tummy which meant they

were hungry and I thought what the heck I have some change in my pocket and will throw it to them. Within seconds they were all over the place doing the same thing.

You were warned not to stray away from the hotel by yourself or without some kind of escort as they would mob you. We befriended a young boy by the name of Joel (kept telling me he wanted my address) this they said do not give to them as you might find them on your doorstep later. He was so smart for such a young child and I was so dumb, he was able to tell me a lot of things. He lived in a little shack, along with a lot of others, with hardly anything in them. They walked up and down the hill continuously with all kinds of things on their heads, what posture and beautiful teeth they had. They had just one place for water which all used for everything and anything. You could not eat anything away from the hotel as it might make you sick.

I did end up going scuba diving with a group and was very interesting and beautiful to see the colorful coral. Some also went to VOO DOO ceremonies but I opted out and was told I made the right decision. It was really scary. It was told that many would take their newborn babies and put them in the hot sun for hours to ruin their eyes and become better beggars for the family. It was nothing to see a mother alongside the road with a child with horrible eyes with their hands begging. The billboards were advertising something that I could not read and was told it was ads for birth control, which I don't think too many looked at. It looks like things have not changed much since I was there over 30 years ago. The whole trip cost about \$180.00 round trip, plane fare, feed, and hotel. The weather was great. They say you live from experience and I did learn a lot from this. I still cannot believe why I even thought about such a thing. This was a year before I went through several surgical operations and 4 stays in the hospital, maybe that has something to do with my reasoning. IF YOU EVER THINK ABOUT GOING TO HAITI MAYBE YOU BETTER CHECK IT OUT WITH ME BEFORE YOU MAKE THE TRIIP!!!!

2010 NSP/NBD Budget Cuts

Both NSP and NBD is being severely reduced this year due to City of Cincinnati budget cuts. In 2009 each neighborhood was allowed up to \$7,000 NSP and \$9,000 NBD per year. This year the amounts will be up to \$5,000 NSP and \$2,000 NBD. We generally use the funds for beautification, the newsletter, Ebersole Center, etc. We have been discussing strategies to getting as much accomplished as possible, but it is clear cuts will need to be made.
