SPRING IN OLD CALIFORNIA

Here we are into spring finally, wondering if it would happen or not. Spring gets me thinking of how much things have changed over the years. Looking back I can still see what it was like during the GOOD OLD DAYS. The same as today we were fighting the Old Ohio River with its many ups and down. This year seemed so similar. The thoughts of just warmer weather makes you feel like things should be getting into the warmer mood.



Just to see Mr. John Spence dragging his tractor out, traveling down to the river, the river stage then was only 12 ft. in pool, so you had lots of bottom land and many used to grow the most wonderful corn, and he specialized in white corn. Many would come by just to buy corn. What a gentleman he was. He made California his home after floating down the river from Portsmouth area in a houseboat and his animals. He may have worked on the building of the new Water Works as he talked about it. Each year at the same time, you could see his dedication to farming. My side yard that is grass now he used to grow sugar mel-

ons, which were delicious so he said. Along with that he had his residence on the corner of Croslin and Eldorado where he had a small grocery store with a library also, which Cinti. Library would bring books to him. Many times as a little girl I would walk up sit at the little desk, pick out a book and he would stamp it. I suppose he and his wife did not see eye to eye and built her a home on Panama St Many times he would sit on the edge of my front porch and just talk to me.

Look, that must be Old Beck, Herman Becker from Panama St. waltzing down the street with his spirits in hand and carrying one in a jug. I think Shockey would like to take aim at the jug or maybe I just thought he did. Old Beck bothered no one in a world to himself. He could be heard singing "Going to see my Chill on Three Mile Hill", naturally one of his lady friends. His mother would call my dad over a Beck was seeing creatures climbing the walls and she needed sine help. Beck was honored quite a bit because of his rich sister, even donated our beautiful stained glass window "Jesus in Gethsemane" in memory of Beck.

Walking up too from the river is Old Joe Parker. Joe lived in a very small structure that probably floated down the river. He would walk up to the store with his big fat pig trailing behind him. He had a mansion, so he thought.

Children were all over, as we had an abundance of kiddies playing. Maybe shooting marbles, even I had a bag of marbles and played. Then there was mumbley peg, can you believe with a knife. Stick horses would be lined up with rope around it like a horst so we could ride away when time came. Then there was looking for empty food cans to put on your feet running and making all kinds of noise. And what a joy to cross Panama St. to the overgrown growth and trees which was my sanctuary. I do believe that I would go down there to be by myself and dream of making and having a difference in my life, climbing a tree and swinging down on it like an ape. Many folks and younger people would go to the river and built fires, help themselves to some of the corn or bring a potato to place in the fire until black, they were so good.

Mr. Schilling and many others plowing their ground readying for the spring planting. Afterall most would have to depend on these crops for the winter. Even I, to this day plant some green onions, don't know why but I still make sure I have some each year.

Many of the children had their first jobs picking strawberries on Mr. Smailes farm, sometimes we ate more than we picked. I think we only got a few nickels but to us that was great. He covered all these fields with straw to keep the plants from freezing each year.

Our main enjoyment as children was the friendship we had with all the other children, of which there were so, so many. THOSE WERE THE GOOD OLD DAYS..
